

## Strategic & Action Plan 2024 - Tarrangower Cactus Control Group Inc.

<b>Objective</b>	To provide advice and support to private landowners and public land managers to control Wheel Cactus ( <i>Opuntia robusta</i> ) infestations.
<b>Goals</b>	to reduce and contain the core Wheel Cactus infestations within the Maldon area of focus.
	to prevent the spread of Wheel Cactus to outlying areas in the Mount Alexander Shire and beyond.
<b>Area of Focus</b>	Area bounded by Cairn Curran Reservoir to the west, Bradford Road to the north, Maldon-Lockwood Road and Maldon-Newstead Road to the east, and Trudgeons Road to the south.
<b>Strategies</b>	Motivate private (especially new) landowners to control Wheel Cactus infestations by increasing awareness & providing advice & assistance.
	Engage private landowners to participate in Wheel Cactus control by encouraging neighbourhood networking and working bees.
	Promote integrated management strategies including the use of Cochineal Biological Control.
	Encourage volunteers to help control Wheel Cactus on public lands, especially the Maldon Historic Reserve, by providing equipment loans.
	Maintain partnership with Parks Victoria and encourage participation of other local Landcare and environment groups.
	Maintain partnership with Mount Alexander Shire to increase engagement and compliance with current, new and absentee landowners.
	Lobby the Victorian Government to increase resources to enforce the Catchment & Land Protection Act 1994 on non-compliant landowners.
